Mrs Walsh and the Golden Book


In the Head teacher office, sits a small golden book with a small golden pen. Some children have seen this golden book, some even have their names written in this golden book.

Seesaw Class & Google Classroom

We have now amended our online learning platform to support continued progress in using the most cost effective product for sustained use across the school.

To this end, we will be maintaining Seesaw Family as a tool for share learning in class with families at home.

The functionality of Seesaw Class was extremely supportive during online learning where children could post completed work to staff, as we worked to develop skills in school on the uses of Google Classroom. Now that remote learning has ended, we are using the time to further enhance the use of Google Classroom as the sole area for posting activities for home tasks and sharing completed home tasks with the teacher. Seesaw Class app will now end to ensure all classes are consistently using the one area for posting.

Teachers will work with children in class over the next few weeks in posting through Google Classroom and will continue to share class timetables via Google Classroom weekly for parents to view. This will help parents feel connected to the class learning and maintain the partnership between home and school now that children have returned fully.

A parent help guide will also be sent home with children to assist you in uploading activities for teachers.

All communication between parents and staff should be sent via school email / phone calls to the office.
