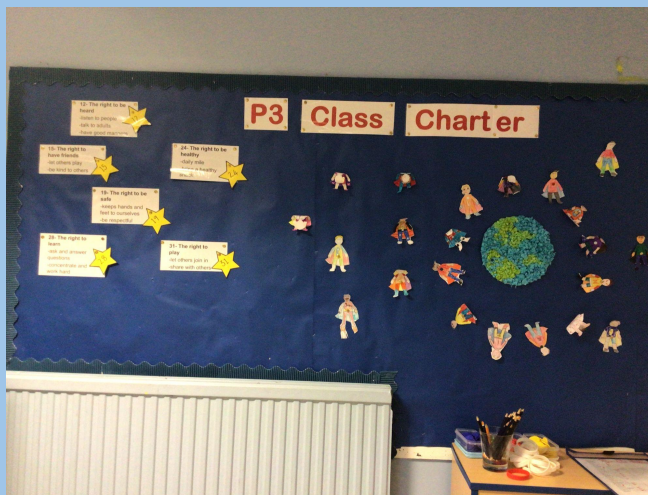

Full School Charter

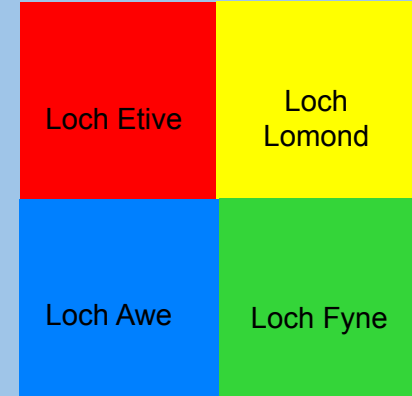

P1-4 Sponsored Bounce

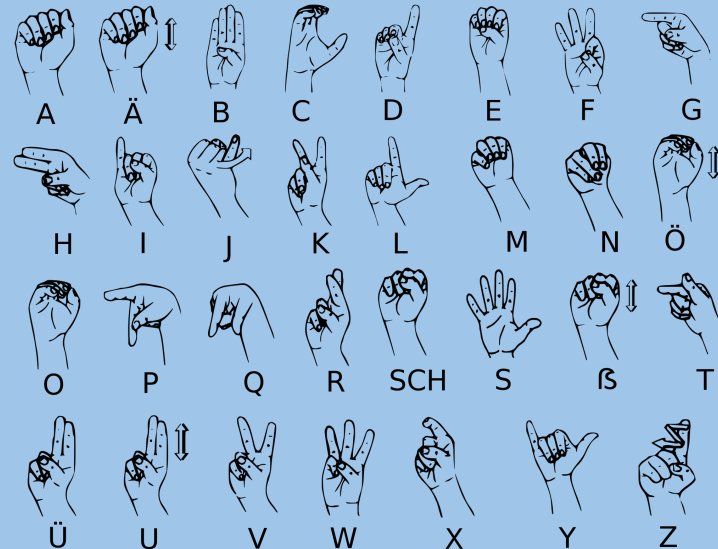
